

Do you have dyskinesia and Parkinson's disease?

Researchers from Dr. Oury Monchi's lab at the University of Calgary need your help!

We are working with a research team from Montreal to study the motor symptoms of Parkinson's disease. We are measuring how well medication controls the motor symptoms of Parkinson's disease, including dyskinesia. Dyskinesia are the involuntary wriggly, squirmy movements that may occur from taking Parkinson's medications.

This research study involves a single study visit lasting about 2.5 hours, and includes:

- Answering questions about your quality of life and social activities
- Doing simple tasks (ex. walking a short distance, reading, etc.) while you wear special clothes (over your clothes) that have movement sensors

The study visits will happen at the main University of Calgary campus. We will reimburse you \$50 to cover any study-related expenses.
